

MITIGATION ACTIONS	DETAILS
Discharge management	Where seabirds are present, do not discharge biological material when fishing gear is in the water
Deploy warp deflector	The skipper and crew shall ensure that warp deflectors (pinky buoys) are attached to the warps where there is potential of threat to seabirds
